- f) Technical and economic cooperation for the development of agri-food, educational, health, social infrastructure, communications and any other projects aimed at fostering development among the most vulnerable people in Africa.
- g) Humanitarian aid.
- h) Awareness-raising in Spain of the problems of the most vulnerable people and global citizenship education.

## 4. Projects, results and beneficiaries

### 4.1. Omwaana Tugende Children's Home

#### 4.1.a. Description of the project

**Omwaana Tugende Children's Home** for abandoned and abused children takes in children from all over the districts of Kakumiro and Kibaale in close cooperation with the District Probation Office. It is officially recognised by the Ugandan Government as a Home for abandoned and extremely vulnerable children. The ethos of the home is to recreate, as far as possible, a typical Ugandan home. For this cause the children live in small houses each with its own specific caretakers and a close relationship between the children is fostered. The home also has a vegetable garden that supplies fruit, vegetables and pulses and which gives the children the opportunity to learn basic farming techniques. All the children attend St Joseph's primary school, with the youngest ones attending the Adelante África Nursery School.

In 2022 the Children's Home resumed normal activities, following the COVID-19 lockdown of the previous year. During the year the home housed an average of 58 children and 10 full-time staff, plus a part-time social worker.

#### Other services within this activity:

**The animal husbandry project**, set up in 2014 and still ongoing, has given the children of the Home valuable experience in looking after livestock at the same time as providing them with eggs and meat.

**Community Hall.** In 2013 a community hall was opened as part of the Omwaana Tugende Children's Home complex. It has independent access so that other NGOs, schools and public organisations can use it for seminars, presentations and meetings. It also houses the Adelante África Nursery School and is where the children of the Omwaana Tugende Children's Home have their meals, receive extracurricular evening classes and do their homework. The hall has solar-powered lighting, which means that during a power cut it has some light.

**The family visiting and/or resettlement programme** encourages members of the local community to take children into their homes for short periods of time, generally weekends and holidays. It also encourages the safe return of children to live with their own families or with foster families. In the latter case, Adelante África pays the school fees and maintenance costs of the rehoused children.

In 2022, 14 children were rehoused legally with their own families by the representative from social affairs and 12 were living with foster families.

**Emergency aid to families with orphans or suffering extreme poverty.** The programme aims to support vulnerable families to enable them to look after their own children. It also supports vulnerable children in some remote schools in the area.

##### The beneficiaries and how they are helped:

In the area where we work, there is a high incidence of one-parent families (usually the mother) or families where both parents have died, often of AIDS, the incidence of which is growing again. The children who are taken into the Home are abandoned or vulnerable children. They receive the health care, affection and nutrition they need and have the chance to live in a community, play with other children, help with domestic tasks and attend school.

There are also a number of families who receive emergency loans or direct aid. These are selected after carefully monitoring and interviews with the mother to determine the best way to give them support. In most cases we help with the school fees of their children.

#### **Requirements to qualify as a beneficiary:**

The necessary requirements are only to reside in the area where the project is carried out and to be in a situation of vulnerability and poverty. In the case of the children admitted into the children's home, they need to have court orders, officially recommending them for institutional care.

### **4.1.e. Results obtained and degree of compliance with statutory aims**

#### **Results obtained:**

**Omwaana Tugende Children's Home** operates in accordance with the regulations issued by the Ugandan Ministry of Gender, Labour and Development and was congratulated for its links with the local community and for its rehousing and family stay programmes

From August 9 to 11 2022 we received a visit from an Associate Professor from the University of South Carolina, who came to give a seminar on "The Emotional and Mental Health of vulnerable children and/or those who have suffered some kind of trauma". The course was assessed very positively by all the participants, who included both the carers from the Children's Home, social workers from the district's Office of Education and Development, teachers and employees from other NGOs working directly with children.

#### **Degree of compliance with statutory aims:**

The Children's Home is fundamental to the achievement of the overall aims of the NGO. Thanks to the contributions and support received from our members and collaborators the activities planned for 2022 have been carried out almost to 100%.

### **4.2. Educational projects**

#### **4.2.a. Description of the projects**

These projects are aimed at promoting education among the most disadvantaged. They include the following services:

**St Joseph's Primary School.** St Joseph's is a state school, initially built by the local community and later rebuilt by Adelante África, for orphans and for the children of refugees and families living in extreme poverty. Children from the local community who cannot pay school fees also attend. The number of pupils has increased from 75 in 2008 to over 500 at present. Adelante África pays the fees of the children in the home, orphans and other children in extreme situations. We also pay for the weekly visits of a nurse and the medicines she prescribes, as well as collaborating with the families to provide a daily cup of porridge for all the children.

**The Adelante África Nursery School.** In September 2013, a nursery school was opened in the Omwaana Tugende Community Hall from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. every day. The lessons are in English to lay a sound foundation for the children's primary education. The school is non-profit and Adelante África pays the fees of the orphans and of the children from the Children's Home.

**Further Education Sponsorship programme.** Since Adelante África initial involvement in St Joseph's Primary School, and as part of the development plans for the community, we have looked for secondary school as well as vocational training sponsors. These are for the children who, although they did well in the PLE (Primary Leaving Exam) would not be able to continue their education because they have no economic resources. All the children who are sponsored sign a commitment to help another child through secondary school once they have finished their education and have a job.

**The Adelante África Secondary School.** The school opened in February 2017. Our school is a non-profit and non-denominational secondary school. We aim to provide quality secondary education so that the most vulnerable children who have passed the exams on completing primary school can continue studying for the Ugandan Certificate of Education (UCE).

**F.A.L. (Functional Adult Literacy).** Around 90% of the adult population of Igayaza is illiterate. The teachers of the Functional Adult Literacy Groups teach women and men in the community to read and write both in their mother tongue and in English, at the same time as widening their practical knowledge in the areas of health, agriculture and human rights. Adelante África pays the teachers' salaries and gives each group T-shirts with their own distinctive motif.

##### The beneficiaries and how they are helped:

The beneficiaries of St Joseph's primary school receive a weekly visit from a nurse and the medicines she brings, both funded by Adelante África. We also contribute the sugar for the daily porridge for all the children, and we pay the school fees of orphans or children living in a state of extreme poverty.

The beneficiaries of the nursery school mainly come from the neighbourhood closest to the school but also include the youngest children (3 to 5 year-olds) from the Children's Home. This facilitates their integration into the community. Children receive a quality kindergarten education, in English, at a low cost or free of charge for those who come from vulnerable families or are orphans. It also means that mothers can work in the mornings without having to take care of their children at the same time.

The beneficiaries of the secondary and vocational training sponsorship program are orphans or children from very poor families who, otherwise, even if they passed the primary school leaving exams, would not be able to continue their studies. Their sponsors pay the school fees and meals, with a cost of about 30 euros per month per student.

The beneficiaries of the Secondary school are pupils who have passed the Primary school leaving exams with good grades but whose families are not able to fund their secondary education.

The beneficiaries of the adult education program (F.A.L.) are more than 1,000 poor or extremely poor families from the community. Almost 80% of the participants of these groups are women.

##### Requirements to qualify as a beneficiary:

The necessary requirements are only to reside in the area where the project is carried out and to be in a situation of vulnerability and poverty. Sponsored children in the secondary school programme, also have to commit to helping another child in need to complete secondary school once they have a job.

#### 4.2.e. Results obtained and degree of compliance with statutory aims

##### Results obtained:

**St Joseph's School** continues to have an excellent reputation in the area attracting more pupils and with very motivated teachers. In 2022 funds were again allocated to paying school fees for 44 children from the Children's Home, 33 of whom attend during the day and 11 of whom are boarders. We also support the attendance at St Joseph's of another 28 orphans rehoused with foster families or in very vulnerable situations.

**The Nursery School** continues to be very popular and in 2022 received 96 children between the ages of 3 and 5, distributed among three levels. 19 children from our Children's Home attended classes. We also support another 20 children from the local community by paying their nursery school fees.

**The Further Education Sponsorship Programme** grew and diversified with the sponsorship of children, not only in the Adelante África Secondary School but also in other local schools in the area and particularly in Vocational Training courses. In 2022 we covered the school fees of 80 pupils who are sponsored in the Adelante África Secondary School, along with the enrolment fee and in some cases also other educational needs, of 7 students in professional or vocational training courses.

**The Adelante África Secondary School** ended the 2022 school year with a total of 241 children enrolled, including the 80 children sponsored by Adelante África, divided almost equally among the four levels of secondary education. The results obtained in the *Ugandan Certificate of Education* were once again outstanding after the two years of the pandemic. The school is now ranked number 1 in the Kakumiro district rankings and number 87 in the list of schools with the best results in Uganda.

During the year the lighting around the school was improved and extended, paths within the school grounds were paved, the new science lab was equipped and the computer room was improved due to the installation of a wireless network. In addition, we built a bathroom for the management staff and teachers and in the sports grounds a “fronton” or “pelota” court, thanks to a donation from a Spanish donor.

**The Functional Adult Literacy Programme** has proved itself to be one of Adelante África’s most successful initiatives and is a real driver for change. There are currently 11 F.A.L. groups which, apart from literacy classes, have this year learnt to make soap with medicinal properties and to grow mushrooms.

## Degree of compliance with statutory aims:

Adelante África’s educational activities are fundamental to the achievement of the overall aims of the NGO. Thanks to the contributions and support received from our members and collaborators the activities planned for 2022 have been carried out almost to 100%.

### 4.3. Development and Health projects

#### 4.3.a. Description of the projects

The aim is to empower individuals or groups to set up or expand income-generating projects and in this way to boost the local economy. We also promote and support various interventions, including health projects, with the ultimate goal of improving the living standards of families in the area.

This includes the following projects:

**Community loans (micro-finance):** These are to help community members with few or no resources to start small income generating businesses to improve the living conditions of their families. Loans are returned through regular instalments with zero interest and the beneficiaries undertake to make a contribution in kind or labour in favour of the association.

**Sewing and hairdressing classes.** These classes are designed for girls who are unable to attend or complete secondary school, usually because of lack of funds since secondary school is not free. The classes offer an alternative to early marriage. The girls learn to sew or basic hairdressing techniques and this allows them to have an occupation at the end of the course. Adelante África funds the rent of the premises, the course materials (such as the sewing machines) and the teachers’ salaries.

**The Igayaza women's sewing group:** This is currently composed of women from neighbouring villages and in some cases of students who have attended the sewing classes. Adelante África buys fabrics and then purchases, for further re-sale in Europe, the items that the women make like cushion covers, aprons, backpacks, pencil cases, etc. This allows the women to cover basic needs such as medicines and school fees. All funds received go to finance this and other projects in the area.

**Homemade water tanks:** This is a project to help families build their own tanks to harvest rainwater from their roofs. Adelante África has continued to support the project in 2022.

**Green vegetables project:** The project aims to encourage the cultivation and increase the consumption of green vegetables in the community. Adelante África provides free green vegetable seeds, both native and imported, to several cooperatives. Once they have grown their crops and have a surplus, they are asked to contribute a small amount of the harvest to feeding the children at the Omwaana Tugende Children's Home. Adelante África has continued to support the project in 2022.

**Vitamin A and Chicken Vaccination Projects:** Vitamin A helps prevent childhood blindness and reduces the effects of other diseases such as measles. In 2013, Adelante África partnered with the NGOs Healing Wings and World Vision. Since then, Adelante Africa has maintained its continued support.

**Other Health Projects:** Previously Adelante Africa has carried out medical campaigns, but these were suspended in 2020 due to the pandemic and until now it has not been possible to resume them. However, we continue to provide support via the Diabetes Association in Igayaza to anyone suffering from the illness, as well as online consultation with Spanish doctors primarily in the areas of dermatology and nutrition education.

##### The beneficiaries and how they are helped:

All the beneficiaries live in poverty or extreme poverty and in areas where there are few or no economic resources. We work with the local communities to help give support and resources to improve the standard of living of families in the area.

##### Requirements to qualify as a beneficiary:

The necessary requirements are only to reside in the area where the project is carried out and to be in a situation of vulnerability and poverty.

In the case of the community loans, we select the beneficiaries according to their needs, the number of people who will benefit from the project they want to undertake and their trustworthiness. They also commit to contributing to the sustainability of the project, paying back in kind as agreed in the loan agreement.

#### 4.3.e. Results obtained and degree of compliance

##### Results obtained:

The **community loans project** has proved to be one of the most successful initiatives of Adelante África and is a real driver of change. Beneficiaries continue to pay back their loans and the project offers hope of a better future for many families in the area.

**Hairdressing and sewing classes. Women's Sewing Group of Igayaza.** The project has changed its focus towards the group of young women who are not able to go to secondary school and who would be destined to become very young wives and mothers or subsistence farmers.

A total of 52 students were enrolled in 2022, 30 in the hairdressing course and 22 in the sewing course. The two students who achieved the best results in the sewing course are working in the Women's Sewing Group and making school uniforms for the children in the Children's home.

**Homemade water tanks.** During the year 30 new water tanks were built to store rainwater and another 11 were repaired. A further 22 families have already requested aid for the construction of new water tanks in their homes.

**The Vitamin A and deworming project and the chicken vaccination project.**

In 2022 there were two campaigns in each of the vitamin A and chicken vaccination programmes. The vitamin A vaccination programme vaccinated 2,216 and 5,292 children respectively while the chicken vaccination programme vaccinated 3,624 and 8,991 birds in each respective campaign.

**Other health projects.** The diabetes care programme, through the distribution of glucometers and exercise routines which help to maintain a healthier lifestyle, has directly benefitted 27 members of the Association in 2022. Likewise, online assessment continued to be provided via consultation from local health centres with some of the Spanish doctors who participated in the medical campaigns previously, benefitting a large number of families in the area.

## Degree of compliance with statutory aims:

These projects are fundamental to the achievement of the overall aims of the NGO. Thanks to the contributions and support received from our members and collaborators, the plans foreseen for 2022 were almost 100% achieved.

## 5. Resources

### 5.1 Volunteers and employees

During the first seven months of 2022 a technical (non-managerial) professional was hired for the on-site supervision of all projects, as well as for the establishment of a control structure to ensure compliance with local governmental obligations and internal procedures in a sustainable manner. The experience has proved totally satisfactory and fulfilled all expectations.

The other members of Adelante Africa are volunteers who make their personal resources available to the association for the achievement of its social goals. The human resources employed during the 2022 financial year was 36, including 21 Ugandan volunteers who make up the local organisation in Africa, of whom 9 are board members (the Ugandan board also includes two members of AA Spain).

The members of the organisation in Spain control the funds donated by our supporters from beginning to end. They set the association's objectives and plan and monitor all the projects on the ground by intervening directing in the decisions made by the local members in Uganda They keep in close contact with the local authorities and NGOs visiting them whenever possible. They promote the association and organise and run fund-raising events. They also visit schools throughout the year to talk about the organisation.

During 2022, as part of the awareness-raising and outreach activities carried out in Spain by means of talks relating to the Adelante Africa's humanitarian work in Uganda, the association's Secretary, Jane P. Cadwallader gave 5 talks in English in different Official Language Schools in the Madrid region.

The volunteers in Uganda are local leaders from a variety of backgrounds and professions. They are all influential in the community, members of regional and central government, teachers and women who have set up their own businesses. They all give their time and efforts voluntarily to the NGO and Adelante África only funds their transport and telephone expenses while working on the projects.

## 5.2. Offices, Expenses and Sources of Funding

### **Offices of the NGO**

Adelante África's registered office is at Calle Príncipe de Vergara 128 in the premises of a private lawyer during office hours. She allows us to use her address free of charge.

### **Expenses**

Everyone who works with Adelante África does so on a voluntary basis. All members and volunteers put their own private resources towards the achievement of the NGO's aims. All costs incurred by the governing body in order to carry out their duties, such as office supplies, hardware, etc, as well as travel costs, are paid for personally by the people concerned.

### **Grants and public funding**

All Adelante Africa's income comes from private individuals and fund-raising events. Members contribute with standing orders, one-off payments and sponsorship payments. The NGO received no government grant or public funding in 2022.

## 6. Remuneration of Governing Body

As stated in article 28 of the organisation's statutes, all members of the governing body provide their services to Adelante África voluntarily, and do not receive any salary, expenses or remuneration from the NGO either when performing their duties or for duties different from those carried out as a member of the governing body.
